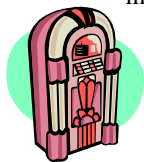
Lion Art Meganck is overall chairperson of our activities. If you have not yet signed up but can help, call Lion Art at 648-0765 to let him know you're available.

• It's a long way to **Saskatoon**, Saskatchewan and back, but the **USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum** was worth every minute of the 2,500 mile round trip. Three Overland Park Host Lions—Neal and Beverly Nichols and Edson Parker—were among 28 Kansans at the September 18-20 event. Ten other Lions from District 17-O attended. Our District had almost as many at the Forum as the rest of the state combined! We all brought back ideas for fund raisers, service projects, and general leadership tips that will strengthen our clubs.

This year's successful bid for the Forum was the result of joint efforts between past international directors—led by PID Gene Vogel—and the Overland Park Convention and Visitors Bureau. Members of all local clubs, as well as Lions from across the state of Kansas, will have the opportunity to be involved in planning and preparation for this big event.

"Lions are Everyday Heroes Performing Miracles Through Service"

A: In 1917, the United States was still pretty-much a nation of immigrants. Newcomers were not familiar with American customs and culture and feared they might be taken advantage of in business affairs. They understood that doctors honored the provisions of the ancient Hippocratic Oath and lawyers practiced under a Canon of Ethics, but in the world of business there was no such code. Lions Club members were generally all business or professional men. By posting the Lions Code of Ethics in their stores or offices, they gave their customers assurance of fair and honest treatment. Lions Code of Ethics

TO SHOW my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.

TO SEEK success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts of my part.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

ALWAYS to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

TO AID others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

TO BE CAREFUL with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.
