#### Effort for Special Nelson Lear Memorial Approved by Board of Directors

Our Club's Board of Directors voted on January 3 to make an effort to name the track at the Kansas State School for the Blind in honor of former Lion Nelson Lear. Nelson was the driving force behind the funding and construction of the track and developing a special endowment fund to provide money for operating expenses of the track program at KSSB. Without his dedication and passion, it is possible the track would never have been built.

The track area is called "Lions Field" to recognize the efforts of Lions Clubs to build the track, but also because the State of Kansas does not name facilities after living persons.
